Measles on the rise As you may have seen, measles is back in the headlines, with concerns about the growing number of cases being reported in England and across Europe. Work is ongoing to minimise the risk in Scotland. This includes raising awareness of the signs and symptoms of measles and the MMR vaccine. Although this is typically given as part of routine childhood immunisations, it can be given at any age. Health and Social Care Workforce: Help Us to Tackle Racism survey The Coalition for Racial Equality and Rights (CRER) has been asked by Scottish Government to design and develop anti-racism resources for anyone working in health & social care in Scotland.
