 Alginate bags – also known as 'red bags' these are used to bag up contaminated linen and, because they dissolve, can be put directly into the washing machine. Unfortunately, some areas have ordered in the wrong type of bag. These don't dissolve and are causing blockages and damage to the laundry machines.
