Update from infection prevention & control team We are seeing increased numbers of respiratory and enteric illness which are affecting patients and staff. Please ensure:

- 1. appropriate testing is undertaken when symptoms present. This avoids delays in decision making regarding patient placement and ward closures/opening.
- 2. adhere to IPC practices e.g. water and soap not ABHR for enteric illness
- 3. appropriate use of PPE
- 4. thorough cleaning of environment and shared equipment.
- 5. Staff with symptoms of diarrhoea and/or vomiting must not attend work. If this develops at work, they must leave immediately. They must remain off work until 48hrs symptom-free.

Social Media Use – a reminder There is no doubt social media can be a positive force but, as we're sure you are all aware, it can also have a negative impact on us as health & social care family, Unfortunately, there have been a couple of recent examples where current members of NHS Grampian staff have posted – anonymously or otherwise – comments and material which is disrespectful, or calls into question other teams or staff groups.

While these incidents are absolutely in the minority, it's disappointing, and we'd like to remind you of the advice in the <u>Personal Use of Social Media guidance</u>; take a second and pause before posting to imagine how your comments may come across and their potential impact on your colleagues. As well as this guidance, those of you registered with professional bodies such as the GMC, NMC, or HCPC, should consult their social media policies

Remember, be kind to one another, we're all in this together!

Vaccination – staff drop-in clinics There will be two further drop-in clinics, open to anyone working in health & social care and still to get their 'flu or COVID-19 jabs.
