

Further temporary MS Teams video restrictions/Web Filter Change/Connectivity Issues As highlighted at the end of last week, the Teams features providing participant video (for more than two participants) and recording of Teams meetings has been temporarily disabled. Taking these reluctant measures has alleviated pressure on the internet link significantly. The eHealth team is currently working with the vendors to identify a resolution for these problems and all efforts are being made to resolve this as soon as possible. eHealth apologises for any inconvenience caused and appreciate your patience whilst working to resume normal service.

Hypo box - juice supply change from Catering Department Unfortunately, due to manufacturing changes and supplier shortages, we are unable to supply fruit juice cartons that can comply with Hypo box requirements. We have been able to source an alternative juice product for hypo boxes which will be 150ml tins of original Coca-Cola and these deliver 15.9g of carbohydrate per small can. This alternative product is more expensive and should only be ordered by wards via your local catering department/ Kitchen to replenish hypo box fruit juice requirements.

Staff car-park (tarmac) closure – Foresterhill site From 5pm this Friday (26 November) the staff ‘tarmac’ car park, adjacent to the Lady Helen Parking Centre, will close for two days to allow for essential maintenance works. We ask that all vehicles are removed from this area prior to commencement of these works.

Please bear in mind that, whilst we are operating under the Foresterhill Major Infectious Disease Plan, parking restrictions continue to remain relaxed on campus, allowing staff to park within the Lady Helen Parking Centre (Multi Storey Car Park). Where you are able to do so, please utilise this valuable facility in order that as many spaces as possible continue to be available for patients on the core site. We ask that you use from Level 6 and above, to leave spaces on the lower floors available for patients with mobility issues.
