


**Grampian data** Here are the local figures for today and the 7-day rolling positivity rate are shown below. As a reminder, this rate is arrived at by dividing the number of positive tests in the past 7 days by the number of tests carried out in the past 7 days. Repeat tests are included in both categories, whereas the figures we show here only record new tests. **Twice weekly asymptomatic staff testing** Professor Jason Leitch – the National Clinical Director – has recorded <u>this video</u> on the twice weekly asymptomatic staff testing programme. Testing, using Lateral Flow Devices, is now available to anyone working in health & social care, regardless of their role. Further information on the local programme is available <u>here</u>.

**Staff professional registration** Remember, if you use your NHS work email address to communicate with your professional body, you must ensure records are updated with your NHS.scot email address. Professional bodies will not automatically be aware and may continue to use NHS.net addresses with regards to your registration. Don't run the risk of your registration lapsing!
