
COVID-19Brief



Here is the brief for Thursday 12 August 2021.

Grampian data The local update for today, including the 7-day rolling positivity rate, is shown below. As a reminder, this rate is arrived at by dividing the number of positive tests in the past 7 days by the number of tests carried out in the past 7 days. Repeat tests are included in both categories. The figure for the "daily number of new people tested" is only for the number of tests for people who have not been tested previously.



A national update is available on the Public Health Scotland daily dashboard.

STI testing – change in lab system As of 1 September 2021, microbiology testing for Chlamydia trachomatis (CT), Neisseria gonorrhoeae (GC) and Trichomonas vaginalis (TV) sexually transmitted infections (STIs) will be changing in NHS Grampian. As the new system is a fully automated PCR platform, results will be reported as Detected or Not Detected, replacing the current Positive/Negative format. From the 1st of September the department will no longer be able to perform STI testing using BD Probtec swabs/diluent tubes. STI samples will require to be sent using the Abbott multi-Collect Specimen Collection Kit. Testing of first void urines remains unchanged. The department will continue accepting currently used swab types in the interim. Further information on this, including how to order the appropriate kit, is available on the intranet (networked devices only)

Payroll team – new contact arrangements The Payroll team are currently experiencing very high levels of work, mainly as a result of sustained recruitment of additional employees to support our pandemic response and the associated increase in record administration. In order to ensure they can continue to deliver their core service of payroll processing, from Monday 16 August, telephone calls and email contact with the team will be limited to the hours of 2pm – 5pm, Monday – Friday.

NHS Grampian Service of Thanksgiving & Remembrance This annual service, organised by the healthcare chaplaincy team, will be an in-person event, taking place on Sunday 12 September, at 3pm, at Queens Cross Church. The service isn't specifically to remember people who have died from COVID-19 - though it may include them - but it is to remember all our loved ones who have died, of any cause, in any of the Grampian hospitals or units in this past year.

Numbers able to attend in person will be capped at 70, but the service will also be live-streamed via the Queens Cross Church YouTube channel. Places must be booked by **12noon on Friday 10 September**.
