

We have also kept our COVID-19 vaccination programme running which is truly amazing and thank you to all the staff who made it happen.

We have heard some truly heart-warming stories that really highlight the exceptional professionalism and willingness to go the extra mile (or more!) to do the right thing for our patients. From the Community Nurses and home carers who battled drifting snow and treacherous driving conditions (some of them even took to skis!) to make sure that the most vulnerable people in our communities were not left stranded without care and support – to the staff who were meant to be off but volunteered to help out, to ensure that no one that needed care went without, we thank you from the bottom of our hearts. We would also like to mention the exceptional response from our communities. Hotel owners have opened up their hotels for the first time since December to accommodate essential workers unable to get home. Local takeaways have provided staff at our vaccination clinics with sustenance to see them through the long hours. A special mention must also go to the local authority roads teams who, along with farmers the length and breadth of Grampian, have been battling to keep roads clear. The drifting snow may have meant that it felt like a thankless task but we thank you for your efforts. We must also make a special mention to the Community Offroad Transport Action Group (COTAG), a group of trained volunteer 4x4 drivers who have been absolutely vital in helping many of our staff get to and from work over the last week.

Thought for the day - *A huge thank you to all of you, from all of us*! On June 23, 2020, we posed our first question of the day in the Daily Brief. Since then we have posed a further 66 questions, and in total have received an incredible 27,831 responses from staff over this time. This averages at over 400 responses from staff for each question which is fantastic! We have always tried to pose questions that are topical, that can tease out new and emerging themes, and to inform the content of the brief in an effort to ensure staff are receiving the information, support and resources they need.
