Amber weather warning The Amber weather warning for rain, covering much of Aberdeen and Aberdeenshire, has been extended until 9pm this evening. More detailed information was circulated earlier today via the Globals email; you can also get the latest updates from the Met Office website. The weather has caused a significant amount of disruption today; a huge thank you to everyone who has stepped up to meet the challenge, in particular our colleagues in Estates and Domestic Services, who have dealt with an enormous workload.

Antibiotic reporting change World Antibiotic Awareness Week starts today, so this is a good time to let you know that, from 23 November, there will be changes to how antibiotic susceptibilities are reported from the microbiology laboratory. As well as antibiotics being reported as 'sensitive' or 'resistant' there will also be a new category of 'Increased dose required'. Please view the bulletin for key points about this change and the recommended increased doses for the affected antibiotics. A short video learning resource has also been produced on TURAS Learn, to provide more detailed information about these changes.
