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Monkeypox – new guidance New guidance has been published on the management of suspected monkeypox cases in primary and community care. The National Infection Prevention & Control Manual has also been updated. Links to both are below. There are currently six confirmed cases of monkeypox in Scotland and the risk to the general public remains extremely low.

Referral to the service should always be considered for patients where frailty is present with an acute medical issue, who can be assessed and managed at home, thereby providing an alternative to hospital admission. Working in partnership with NHS Highland The bi-monthly Executive Collaborative Oversight Group (ECOG) met again last Friday. The group, which is co-chaired by NHS Grampian and NHS Highland Chief Executives Caroline Hiscox and Pam Dudek, is made up of senior colleagues from key public sector partners in Highland and Grampian. Together they lead work on shared challenges, such as workforce supply, financial constraints, service demand and living/working with COVID-19.

If you have an idea for working in partnership with NHS Highland, here's how you share it:

- Identify the area where collaboration will improve the desired outcome. (Use an SBAR template to capture idea).
- Get in touch with the relevant NHS Board counterpart to discuss the idea and opportunities.
- Share the idea using the SBAR form with ECOG Programme Manager (<u>carmen.gillies@moray.gov.uk</u>) asking for support if required.
- The ECOG Programme Manager will share the SBAR with Chief Executives from NHS G and NHS H. Feedback will be given and if idea is agreed by both Chief Execs, SBAR will be added to ECOG agenda.
- The SBAR will then presented at ECOG by Sponsors from NHS Highland and NHS Grampian.

Fully funded PhD opportunity for nurses/midwives A unique opportunity to study full-time for a PhD has been made available to nurses and midwives working in NHS Grampian. The funding is offered jointly by NHS Grampian and the Division of Nursing & Paramedic Practice in Queen Margaret University. The funding covers wages (equivalent to the maximum of top increment Band 5) and academic fees, enabling the nurse or midwife to be released 0.8 WTE to undertake this PhD study over three years. This PhD is of strategic importance for the organisation as it is seeks to understand and improve how the care assurance framework can be used to inform and enhance practice and patient outcomes. 
