For the record Clearly and accurately recording all elements of the care provided to people in our hospitals – diagnosis, medications, allergies, dietary needs, to name but a few – is vital. Recent checks on records have found an increase in the use of abbreviations and text speak. Professional and regulatory bodies for clinical staff all produce guidance on record-keeping. While the details of these may vary slightly, they all agree on the key points: records must be clear, legible, accurate, completed in good time, and avoid the use of unnecessary abbreviations or jargon.

This is not just to help your colleagues – important though that is – it also recognises medical records can be taken as evidence at public inquiries, during legal action against a healthcare provider, or in criminal cases. Records can also be requested at any time by patients, or their relatives. Think about the notes you have completed. Would a patient understand what we had said? Would the language we use upset them? Would they recognise themselves in those words?

If you have any concerns about your record keeping, please speak to your line manager.

Children's ward in full swing at DGH The children's ward at Dr Gray's is once again offering round-the-clock care and has fully re-opened as a combined inpatient ward and assessment unit.
