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Ectopic pregnancy awareness day – 1 August Ectopic pregnancy affects 1 in 80 pregnancies and remains the leading cause of maternal mortality in the first trimester of pregnancy in the UK. It occurs when the pregnancy implants in an abnormal location - over 95% of ectopic pregnancies implant in a fallopian tube. When an ectopic pregnancy ruptures the symptoms can often be mistaken for other conditions including gastroenteritis, UTIs, and more. It's important for clinical teams to 'Think Ectopic' and check a urine pregnancy test in all women of reproductive age presenting to health services with any sort of abdominal pain or vaginal bleeding.
