Visiting restrictions – DGH We continue to restrict visiting at DGH as we deal with a sickness outbreak. This is a precautionary measure, recognising how widely these viruses are circulating in the community, and will be kept under regular review.

DGH kitchen works Work on the floors in the main production kitchen at DGH is nearing completion. Our current plan is to have all patients back on the standard menu in DGH and all community hospitals from next Monday (16 December). All level 4 IDDSI texture modified meals for all patients in the whole of NHS Grampian will also move back to our own menu from Monday. Meals at DGH will change from the temporary bulk trolley meal service to a trayed meal service from tomorrow (Wednesday), with the current menu choice until running until Monday.

Please note the portacabins and fencing associated with these works will not be removed until **Monday 23 December**, so parking remains reduced.

Christmas meals – part 1 The Pink Zone cafe in ARI will be serving a Christmas menu tomorrow (Wednesday), consisting of Scotch Broth (£1.35), a choice of turkey, beef rib, or Quorn fillet, served with all the trimmings (£7.50), and Christmas cheesecake or Christmas pudding (£3).

The same menu will be on offer at Woodend and Royal Cornhill on Thursday and in DGH next Tuesday.

However, if you would like to order a hot meal for 25 December or 1 January, the catering team are once again offering this option. All you need to do is pop along to your nearest retail catering outlet, or kitchen in the community hospitals, and speak to the catering team to place your order. These will be delivered along with patient lunches on 25 December/1 January. If you are based at Foresterhill, but not working on a ward, you will be able to collect your meal, by arrangement, from the ARI kitchen.
