These challenges relate to both completion of rosters and completion of backfill requests. Use of SafeCare praised at national awards We has been highly commended in the Safer Care category at this year's RLDatix Awards. This recognises an organisation or individual who has made significant strides in promoting patient safety and quality improvement. Our eRostering Team has pioneered the use of SafeCare in teams not yet using Optima (previously known as HealthRoster) eRostering, enabling faster rollout to comply with the Health and Care Staffing (Scotland) Act.

SafeCare offers real-time staffing assessments, risk management, and long-term risk monitoring, even without a live eRoster. This enhances staffing visibility across acute and community settings. We have shared our innovative approach with other boards and Health Improvement Scotland, fostering broader adoption across the country. Congratulations and a big thank you to the team, in particular lain Elrick, Gina Thompson, and Colin McNulty for their hard work.

Handwritten labels for blood transfusion, please The blood transfusion laboratory has seen an increase in samples being received with Trakcare labels attached over the last three months from across acute settings. Blood transfusion samples should always be handwritten on the label at the patient bedside, following positive patient identification against paper request form and wristband.
