Putting People First – offering hope through new collaborations As we all know, the health and social care system in Grampian, Scotland and the UK, is under enormous and sustained pressure. We need to find new ways of working to help people live in good health for as long as possible. To better understand how the system can support the needs of our communities, we – staff and members of the public - need to work together as equals, breaking down barriers between services and communities, and transforming the way we deliver care together.

Based on extensive engagement and best practice, NHS Grampian has designed Putting People First, our new approach to listening to and involving everyone living in the local area. Putting People First now has its own webpage, please follow this link to find out more, including how your team can get involved. This is a long-term commitment to changing how we do things, and we are starting with focusing on a small number of priorities to set the foundations over the next 2 years.

Part of setting the foundations is to support a small number of teams to hold appointment/outpatient sessions in local communities. These are known as 'Community Appointment Days' and they focus on a particular condition or service such as physiotherapy. Clinicians will be joined by community supports and charities to offer a 'one-stop shop' to those who come along.

Community Appointment Days are aimed at making services more effective by enabling better collaboration with local resources, helping people to manage their own conditions more effectively, and connecting them with other organisations and groups who can support them.

Recycling reminder It's now 10 years since the Waste (Scotland) Regulations 2012 made it a legal requirement for all businesses to be recycling the key materials of cans, plastics, paper, card and glass. Unfortunately, there are still too many sites across NHS Grampian where this is still not happening properly, or in some cases at all. But you can help! If you find yourself putting recyclable materials into black or orange bags - ask yourself why? Where is the nearest recycling bin? If there is not one where recycling is being produced, they can be ordered on Pecos from our current supplier Wybone. The code for ordering is CAP/AP/70L/FB/WTE/GRN

Recyclable waste disposed of wrongly is costing us around £100,000 per year in additional disposal costs. Recycling makes sense for the planet **and** our bottom line. If you have any questions around what
