**RSV vaccine study suggests reduction in hospitalisations** A new study from Public Health Scotland (PHS), in collaboration with the University of Strathclyde, shows a 62% reduction in respiratory syncytial virus (RSV) related hospitalisations among the eligible age group following introduction of the vaccine.

The study concludes the RSV vaccine is highly effective in reducing hospitalisations in older adults. RSV is a common and highly infectious respiratory virus that affects the breathing system and can be very serious for those who are at the highest risk of serious illness from the infection, including older adults.

The RSV vaccination programme was launched in August last year with adults aged 75-79, including those turning 75 before July 2025, invited to come forward for immunisation ahead of winter. By the end of November 2024, uptake of the vaccine in this older adult population had reached a notable 68%.
