Travel health service Our new travel health service will launch across Grampian next month. This will signpost people to the information they need to travel safely. If required, specialist assessments can be arranged which will give specific advice on any treatment or vaccinations required in advance. Four vaccinations are available on the NHS free of charge – diphtheria, tetanus and polio (DTP), hepatitis A, cholera, and typhoid. Other vaccinations can only be given by private providers, for a small fee.

Lane closure and restricted access - Foresterhill Loop Road, 18 & 19 January As part of works for the new mortuary, a single lane of the Loop Road at Foresterhill will be closed from 7am this Saturday until 4pm on Sunday.

Traffic travelling down via the north end of the road from Ashgrove Road West will have access to The Lady Helen Carpark, BioHub, Foresterhill Medical Centre and the staff car park but will not be able to travel further towards either ED or the Westburn Road exit. The pedestrian footpath on the closed lane side of the road will also be closed. Pedestrians should utilise the footpath on the opposite side of the road. Traffic travelling up from the south end of Foresterhill Road (Loop Road) from Westburn Road will be able to do so as normal.

ED can be accessed via the Westburn Road and Cornhill Road entrances to the site as usual. We apologise for any inconvenience caused by these essential works.
