



What to do in a clinical emergency Do you know who to call in the case of a clinical emergency? It will depend on where you are located and what your local protocol is. This information can be found on clinical emergency protocol signs displayed in your workplace. If you do not have any displayed, please contact the resuscitation department to provide them. For those based in areas where you <u>would</u> call 2222, please see some FAQs below:

- Can I only call 2222 for a cardiac arrest? No, 2222 is a clinical emergency number, which means it can be used for clinical support in any situation where help is need for an unwell person.
- Can I only call a clinical emergency for an in-patient who has become unwell? No, you can call 2222 for support if it is a patient, staff member, visitor or anyone else you may have found unwell.
- I have been told I can't call 2222 for help if it is not in a clinical area. Is this information correct? It is not, as you can call 2222 for help in other areas, such as in corridors, hospital canteens, and staff areas. Just make sure you give a clear location to switchboard when making the call.
- What time of day is 2222 support available? 2222 can be called 24 hours, seven days a week.
- Can I call 2222 if I need help outside the hospital, but still on hospital grounds? Such as in a hospital car park? There is currently no confirmed policy for this as such, but it is recommended that 2222 and 999 are both called for a dual response.

No purchase order, no payment One of the financial controls we have in place is a policy of 'no purchase order, no payment'. This is outlined in our <u>Standing Financial Instructions</u> (networked devices only). It ensures all orders for goods and services are made through authorised suppliers, subject to appropriate due diligence checks, and all commitments are within delegated financial limits. If you are responsible for procurement activity, remember we only pay for goods or services where the order is supported by a valid contractual agreement and/or a valid purchase order. This control also protects our organisation from the significant risk of procurement fraud.
