The family of Edward (Eddie) Stevenson have asked us to share news of his death last weekend, at the age of 81. Eddie worked in the Medical Physics team at ARI for decades and was part of the team which developed the world's first MRI scanner in Aberdeen. He also, for 36 years, put on **the** best Christmas display in Aberdeen, in the front garden of his home on Ashgrove Road West, raising thousands for local charities. Many of you will have worked with Eddie, many more of you will have enjoyed those Christmas displays. Our thoughts are with the Stevenson family at this sad time.

As a reminder, we are offering whooping cough vaccination to healthcare workers who have regular, close, clinical contact with severely ill or unimmunised infants, or with those in the final month of pregnancy, and to those staff who have regular, close, contact with unimmunised infants, such as nursery staff in baby rooms.
