Whooping cough (pertussis) vaccination for healthcare workers We've previously shared information in this brief about whooping cough (pertussis). Cases in the community are continuing to increase. As such, the Chief Medical Officer and Chief Nursing Officer have advised boards to offer vaccination to healthcare workers who regularly encounter anyone in the late stages of pregnancy and young infants. Occupational Health are now ready to invite the following groups for vaccination:

- Healthcare workers with regular and close clinical contact with severely ill or unimmunised infants and women in the last month of pregnancy in the hospital or community settings. This includes midwifery, obstetrics, maternity settings, neonatal units and paediatric intensive care, paediatrics, and Health Visitors.
- Other staff whose work involves regular, close and prolonged contact with unimmunised infants such as nursery workers in baby rooms

Anyone in the above groups who has had a pertussis containing vaccination in the **last five years** does **not** need to be re-vaccinated. Anyone in the above groups who is pregnant should be vaccinated through the maternal pertussis programme. Drop-in vaccination clinics will be provided by the Scottish Ambulance Service in the car parks at the following venues:
