**Mental health bed base review** A bed base review of inpatient mental health beds across Grampian has been commissioned with the aim of achieving a balance between capacity and demand within the resources we have. This will involve looking at usage of service areas, and how pathway redesign can help put the system back in balance. For context, this system sits at G-OPES level 4 most days.

The mental health bed base review is drawing on the experience and expertise of those working in the system to understand how to better match capacity to demand, and how the risks associated with any change proposals can be safely managed. Two recent workshops involved stakeholders across the health & social care partnerships and specialist services and resulted in very informative discussions. Further updates will be provided via this brief as the review progresses.

**World Antimicrobial Resistance Awareness Week** Antibiotic resistance is a serious and growing healthcare challenge. Analysis of deaths in the UK in 2019 found an estimated 7,600 were directly due to infections resistant to antibiotics. Our antimicrobial stewards will be working throughout this week to raise awareness, share guidance on appropriate prescribing, and remind the public antibiotics do **not** work on viral infections. Lane closure – loop road, Foresterhill Work on the new mortuary at Foresterhill will require restrictions on the loop road this weekend (23/24 November). Traffic coming from the Westburn Road side will be able to use the road as normal. However, traffic coming from Ashgrove Road West will only have access to the car parks, ONE BioHub and Foresterhill Health Centre – there will be **no through route.** Access to the Emergency Department will be via the Westburn Road or Cornhill Road entrances to the Foresterhill site.
