PhD opportunity for nurses, midwives, and AHPs (NMAHPs) There is opportunity for fully funded PhD fellowships which focus on multi-morbidity research which NMAHPs can apply for. The start of the fellowship is 1st August 2025. Where possible a 6-month preparatory period should begin at the start of February, and we will work with Fellows and their employers to organise release from their current clinical duties for an equivalent to one day a week (20% protected academic time), to work with their supervisors to define the PhD project.

Update to isolation period for COVID-19 for Hospitalised Patients With effect from 1st August 2024, National Guidance for the isolation period for hospitalised Sars cov 2 detected patients has been revised.

The isolation period is now 5 days from symptom onset (or first positive test if symptom onset undetermined) including resolution of fever for 48 hours without the use of medication.

If the patient is severely immunosuppressed or symptoms persist beyond 5 days, testing may be used to support decision-making (2 negative LFD tests taken 24 hours apart).
