Appropriate use of patient provisions As part of the Value & Sustainability Programme, it is essential we are efficient with our resources. All inpatient wards have pantries stocked with snacks and beverages which are for patient use **only**. These are carefully stocked to ensure there is appropriate food, fluid, and nutritional options for the people we care for.

This includes tea, coffee, milk, biscuits, bread and all other provisions supplied by the catering department. Consuming catering supplies compromises the items available and necessary for supporting the food and fluid requirements of patients.
