'Flu - a growing challenge As of 18 December, there were 46 people in our hospitals with 'flu; more than treble the number seen the week before. In the community, GP consultations for 'flu-like illnesses increased four-fold in the week ending 8 December. These figures are being replicated across Scotland and across the UK. It's never been more important to get your free 'flu (and COVID, if you are eligible) vaccine. For colleagues in ARI, there is a drop-in vaccination clinic in the ED fracture clinic today, 9.30am-4pm. More broadly, all Grampian vaccination clinics (except Airyhall and Bridge of Don) are offering drop-ins for health and social care staff. Details on centre locations and opening hours are available here: <u>Centres | Vax Grampian</u>. Please note the clinics will be closed for the Christmas/New Year public holidays.

MS Forms update – syncing with Excel There will be an update next month (13 January) to MS Forms which will affect how responses are synced to Excel. The potential implication of this is responses may still be collected in the Form, but they may not be synced to the worksheet in Excel. Research & Development (R&D) strategy delivery workshop Delivery of our R&D strategy 2024-29 is being progressed by six Short Life Working Groups (SLWGs), one of these jointly with Robert Gordon University (RGU) and the University of Aberdeen. These SLWGs were formed on 25 June in the first delivery workshop at the Suttie Centre. These SLWGs presented their findings at the second delivery workshop held on Tuesday at RGU, attended by 63 staff and stakeholders. Anyone interested in
