Value and sustainability – ePayslips Following agreement at GAPF earlier on today we will shortly commence a phased roll out of electronic payslips (known as ePayslips) across the organisation, from July. An ePayslip can only be accessed via a networked device; this is a national requirement of the functionality as opposed to an NHS Grampian decision.

Some the benefits of ePayslips for you and for the organisation are:

- Convenience of instant access to your payslip, P60 and P11D (if appropriate) and other information
- Availability you will always be able to access your payslip
- Ability to save, download and/or email to a personal email account
- Affordability as time taken to physically process, sort and deliver payslips is reduced as well as printing, delivery, and postage costs for the organisation
- Increased safety of personal information
- Environmental and financial benefit to the organisation

The phased roll out will be by staff group with some exclusions applying. If you are already signed up to receive ePayslips, you do not need to take any action. More details will follow in the coming weeks.

Blood tests at secondary care hub – action required People are continuing to be referred for blood tests at the secondary care hub without a request on Trakcare, despite previous communication underlining the importance of this. From 1 July, it is the responsibility of clinicians requesting blood tests at the hub to ensure the correct requests are available to staff visible on Trakcare. If the correct request is not available, appointments will be cancelled. Patients will be advised to contact their hospital clinician or speciality to have this arranged and rebook their appointment once this has been done. If support is
