**Reduced Working Week – backfill update** Last month we offered services unable to implement a reduction in the working week – agreed as part of the 2023/34 Agenda for Change deal – the opportunity to request backfill support. We received over 100 submissions. After initial review, some applicants will be asked for further information. We aim to respond to all applicants during the first week of December. We know you are keen for a decision; we need to ensure all requests are properly considered.

**Spotlight on Digital Ambitions: In Conversation with Martin Innes and Adam Coldwells** Since joining us earlier this year, chief digital officer Martin Innes has hit the ground running. In this episode of the "In Conversation" video series, <u>Martin sits down with interim Chief Executive Adam Coldwells</u> to discuss his ambitious vision for Grampian's digital future including:

- Scotland's Leader in Digital Health: Aim to become the leading digital health board in Scotland within three years.

- **New digital hubs:** Martin also unveils plans to establish these hubs across Grampian, providing support for colleagues and the public to build digital skills and tackle common tech challenges.
