Reminder - Reduced Working Week – requesting backfill support Services which have been unable to implement the reduced working week may now request backfill support. Guidance on how this can be requested and the governance process for making decisions on such <u>requests is available here</u>, along with all the reduced working week information (networked devices only).

Backfill requests must be made by Friday 8 November. It should be understood requests are not guaranteed to be fully or partially approved. Backfill requests cannot be made by services which have already reduced their working week.

Relaunch of green bag scheme – QI opportunity The green bag scheme – which supports people to bring their own medication with them when they come into hospital – will shortly be relaunched.
