Weekend weather warnings At the time of writing, the Met Office has extended Yellow weather warnings into the weekend, across Grampian. These cover the risk posed by snow and ice, and the possibility of high winds courtesy of Storm Bert. There is an Amber warning for snow on Saturday for central Scotland, including Stirling, Perth & Kinross, Angus, and just edging into south Aberdeenshire.

Weather is, of course, changeable, so we'd encourage everyone to stay up to date with the Met Office forecasts and to familiarise themselves with the NHS Scotland <u>adverse weather arrangements</u>. We'd also like to emphasise how grateful we are to the teams in Facilities & Estates who have worked hard to clear snow, grit roads and paths, and generally keep us moving. It is appreciated!

Moray Chief Officer appointment The Moray Integration Joint Board has appointed Judith Proctor as Chief Officer for Health & Social Care Moray. Managing access, attire, and the environment - ARI main theatre suite A new standard operating procedure has been developed to manage access, attire, and the environment in the main theatre suite in ARI. This will be phased in, from Monday (25 November), and aims to ensure the safety of all in this area, and the correct use of theatre scrubs and PPE. The procedure can be read here (intranet link, networked devices only). Signage will be in place in the suite from Monday. Access to the suite by staff not allocated to theatres is discouraged; by February 2025 this area will be swipe card access only.

The focus of this event is chronic pain and there will be a drop-in session between 9am and 12pm. Road restrictions – Foresterhill Work on the new mortuary and the Baird and ANCHOR projects will require the following restrictions at Foresterhill:

- From 7am tomorrow (Saturday) vehicles coming from Ashgrove Road West will only be able to
 use the loop road to access car parks, ONE BioHub, and Foresterhill Health Centre there is no
 through access. Traffic from Westburn Road will be able to use the road as normal. These
 restrictions will apply until 4pm on Sunday.
- To allow for footpath improvements, there will be an additional one-way road system in place, from tomorrow (Saturday), outside Maggie's Aberdeen, leading to Royal Aberdeen Children's Hospital and the ARI Emergency Department. This will be in place for approximately two weeks.
