Hidden figures When you make charts or tables using PowerPoint, Excel, Word, etc., did you know the raw data is often still lurking behind the final table or graph? Do you know what information is in the metadata (descriptive data) of your file? Are you aware that blocking out text in Word doesn't remove the text underneath and it **is** still there? It's important to check your files to see if data is 'hiding' **before** documents are shared. This reduces the risk of personal or other sensitive data being shared inappropriately with other colleagues, services or partners, or being released publicly. The Information Commissioner's Office has some really helpful guidance around checking your documents here: <u>How to disclose information safely</u> (esp. paragraphs 31-80).
