'Flu and face mask usage 'Flu and other respiratory illnesses are on the increase in the community and in our healthcare settings. Considering this and, in accordance with the National Infection Prevention & Control Manual (NIPCM), there is increased emphasis on the use of fluid repellent surgical masks (FRSMs)

FRSMs **must** be used as follows:

- worn by a patient, known or suspected to be infected with a respiratory illness, if safe to do so and the patient can tolerate it.
- worn by all staff caring for suspected or confirmed 'flu or other respiratory infection illness to protect against secretions or excretions into the respiratory mucosa (nose and mouth).
- staff caring for suspected and confirmed 'flu positive patients should observe droplet precautions and if undertaking aerosol generating procedures, apply airborne precautions as per NIPCM quidance.
- masks must be well fitting and fit for purpose (fully covering the mouth and nose).
- masks must be removed or changed:
 - o at the end of a procedure/task
 - o if the integrity of the mask is breached, e.g. from moisture build-up after prolonged use or from gross contamination
 - o in accordance with specific manufacturers' instructions

In exceptional circumstances, using a risk-based approach, extended use of masks can be implemented to reduce transmission. Please discuss this with infection prevention and control. Clinical Biochemistry – specialist samples during the festive period Please be aware results for tests referred to external laboratories may be delayed over the festive period due to disruptions in the postal service. All samples received will be stabilised and stored prior to sending. If sending any samples for non-routine biochemistry tests over the festive period, it would be advisable to check the laboratory information pages to see whether this is a referred test. The test index <u>can be accessed here</u> (intranet link, networked devices only).

Referred tests required urgently must be discussed with the Duty Biochemist on ext 51122 (option 3) prior to sending as courier transport may need to be organised.
