iMatter 2024 Since this year's questionnaire went live on Monday, 5470 of you have already completed it! Thank you so much for taking just 5 minutes to share your views, it really does matter. Not shared your views yet? Don't worry, you have until 4pm on Monday 10 June to do so.

Thanks also to colleagues who have shared their views and experiences of the iMatter process with us. What we have heard loud and clear is that what happens in your team, with your team reports makes the biggest difference to your day-to-day experience. We are using this to shape how the support for managers to action plan, with you, will look this year.

Financial position – what a waste! Yesterday we asked you how much it costs us to process black bag waste. The answer, which may surprise you, is £150 per tonne. Multiply that out across all our sites and the costs soon mount up. In comparison, processing recycling waste costs around £40 per tonne. Clearly, we should be doing everything we can to recycle suitable waste and support patients and visitors to do the same. We should also do more to reduce the waste we produce. For example, the disposable coffee cups provided by Aroma cannot be recycled. Bringing you own cup reduces waste and is better for your pocket, as you will get a small discount.

While we are speaking about waste management....

New Blue & Purple lidded WIVA bins on Pecos We now have two new 60 Litre WIVA bins available to order on Pecos. A purple lidded bin - order code 282135 - should be used for disposal of bulky waste and PPE used to administer Cyto medications and treatments.

The blue lidded bin - order code 282128 - can be used for disposal of medicinal (non-Cyto) packaging. Please note the blue lid is a solid lid without the circle clip-top, which is currently on our yellow lids, so has no temporary closure option.

These new colour coded lids will make it a lot easier to segregate these waste streams from others using the current yellow lids and will ensure correct disposal methods of our wastes.

Hospital electronic prescribing and medicines administration (HEPMA) update Work to make HEPMA available in community hospitals will get underway on 3 June. If you support a community hospital and have a role around the Prescribing and Administration Record (PAR), which HEPMA will replace, please complete appropriate eLearning via Turas as this is mandatory for HEPMA access.

SWAN Secure Web Access (SWAN SWA) remote access Due to essential maintenance the SWAN Secure Web Access service will experience a brief interruption during the following dates/times:

There will also be an additional maintenance window between 9am-2pm on Saturday 1 June, which shouldn't impact of use of SWAN SWA but may affect the resilience of the system. We would encourage you to seek alternate remote access solutions (e.g., an NHSG laptop) to ensure you have a stable connection. Remote access from an NHS Grampian device e.g., using AOVPN or Direct Access on a laptop will **not** be affected by this maintenance.

Free Voter ID Voters in Scotland will be required to show ID at polling stations for the UK general election on Thursday 4 July. If you do not have a suitable form of ID you can apply for a free voter ID document, known as a Voter Authority Certificate. There is more information available on the Electoral Commission website: Voter ID | Electoral Commission. That link also contains information about postal and proxy voting. Please note, the location defaults to England, simply select Scotland to see the rules which apply here.
