**Pre-election period guidance - please read** There will be a UK General Election on Thursday 4 July. In the run up to this election (the pre-election period) there is clear guidance for NHS boards to ensure we conduct our business appropriately. The attached letter specifically lists the guidance for us within the NHS. The pre-election period begins at 0.01 Saturday 25 May and will run until the election is concluded.
