**Preparing health and social care for winter** The Scottish Government has announced a record number of NHS 24 call handlers will support the public to access the most appropriate care this winter as services deal with increased demand.

The move will increase service capacity to provide clinical supervision for at least 150,000 additional calls per year and "help prevent unnecessary A&E attendances".

Health Secretary Neil Gray added: "As winter approaches, the NHS will see surges in demand across all health, social care and social work services.

"We will continue our work to reduce delayed discharge in hospitals with an increased focus on effective discharge planning and protecting care at home packages.

"We will also ensure planned care capacity is protected as much as possible in the face of winter pressure so patients are seen as quickly as possible.

"I thank all health, social care and social work staff for their continued efforts and dedication to deliver high quality care. It is fundamental we safeguard their wellbeing, and improved options on flexible working and continued access to mental health resources will ensure staff are supported over this challenging period."

'Gloves Off' for public, employee and planet health Our IPC and waste management colleagues are aiming to improve patient care, have a positive impact on the environment and reduce unnecessary waste by reminding staff to carefully consider whether gloves are required when delivering care.
