Data breach As highlighted via a Global email earlier, a third-party supplier we use to send SMS messages for the requesting/booking/cancelling of bank shifts has suffered a data breach. All messages sent over the last three months are affected. This means mobile numbers and possibly information about work location or shift times have been taken.

Please be vigilant for any unsolicited text messages or phone calls. If you receive any malicious calls or texts, delete and block the number. <u>Our cyber security guide is available here</u>.

Reduced Working Week FAQ Thank to you those who highlighted an incorrect link in this FAQ; it has been replaced with the correct version. <u>All the information you need is available here</u> (intranet link, networked devices only)

Reduced Working Week – domestic and support services update Staying with the reduced working week, and the domestic and support services have been consulting on their plans. They have agreed domestic staff across all sites and porters in some community sites will either take time off in lieu (TOIL) or start their shift later/finish their shift early on a specific day. Depending on site/area and service provisions, this specific day may vary.

We are hopeful this will only have a minimal impact on our service delivery. Tasks not completed due to the implementation of the reduced working week will be written and recorded in the incomplete logbook held in each domestic office. Domestic Supervisors will risk assess this information and monitor it daily. If any issues or concerns arise, please contact your local domestic office in the first instance so that these issues or concerns can be addressed and documented.

Digital proof of immigration status The Home Office is currently replacing physical immigration documents with digital proof of immigration status called an eVisa. As part of the move to eVisas, anyone who uses a physical immigration document to evidence their immigration rights in the UK and who does not already have a UK Visas & Immigration (UKVI) account will need to take action to access their eVisa.
