Excess and Overtime Hours - appropriate recording in SSTS As part of NHS Grampian's work to monitor the reduction in the use of excess and overtime hours we want to remind all authorising managers they should **not** use '*Reason Not Provided*' or '*Other*' as a reason when recording these hours in SSTS. You should use the category that describes the reason why it was necessary to authorise excess and/or overtime hours to be worked. Data from SSTS for Quarter 1 and 2 2024/25, has shown 37% instances of excess and overtime hours recorded as 'Reason Not provided' or 'Other' reason. Your assistance in ensuring the appropriate reason is recorded will help greatly in the continual monitoring of why excess and overtime hours are required.


