**Pre-election period** In case you missed it in Friday's brief, we are now in the formal pre-election period, ahead of the UK general election on Thursday 4 July. Bring your (re-usable) water bottles Did you know it takes 2,000 times more energy to manufacture a bottle of water than it does to produce tap water? Please consider bringing an insulated water bottle to work and using a re-usable cup in our Aroma cafes. Lots of people making small changes can add up to a big impact. This is why ordering bottled water from the catering department to wards will **no longer** be possible unless it is directed by infection prevention and control (IPC) processes. Work has been done to improve the cold-water temperatures in our buildings, and the tap water provided by Scottish Water is high quality. It is also routinely checked internally.

Removing the unnecessary waste and cost of ordering bottles of water is an essential part of everyone supporting our Climate Emergency and Sustainability Strategy. Thank you for being part of it.
