Overtime reduction In September, information was shared via Global email on our work to reduce the use of overtime (Additional Hours) and excess hours. This work is ongoing, and line managers should continue to follow this guidance. However, the ready reckoners provided at the time, illustrating the most cost-effective ways to cover staffing requirements, are out of date considering the 2024/25 Agenda for Change pay agreement. The reckoners have been updated and are available here (intranet link, networked devices only) under 'Overtime'. Please delete previous versions and ensure these versions are the only ones used.

Revised infection prevention & control protocol Please be aware the revised 'NHS Grampian Staff Protocol for the Isolation of Patients who are at Risk of a Transmissible Infection within NHS Healthcare Settings v4' is now live on the IPC intranet page <u>and can be accessed via this link</u> (networked devices only). Please ensure you are using the correct version of this protocol and destroy previous versions.

Acute PACS maintenance – downtime Phillips are performing some routine maintenance and upgrades on the PACS server equipment this Friday (29 November). As such the PACS server will be unavailable briefly (approximately 10 minutes) between 7-8am. If you are trying to send imaging to the PACS server during this time and it does not send correctly, please wait for 10 minutes and resend the imaging manually. We do not anticipate any further disruption to the systems during the maintenance window.

National Distribution Centre (NDC) Winter schedule The changes to this year's ordering and delivery schedule of goods from the NDC during the winter period are <u>available on the procurement intranet page</u> (networked devices only). If you are responsible for ordering, please plan ahead to avoid delays and additional pressure during these weeks.

Use of waste oil and fats to power back-up generators The back-up generators for all new buildings at Foresterhill, such as the new mortuary, are to be powered with hydrotreated vegetable oil (HVO), in our latest step towards reducing carbon emissions. The HVO fuel will be sourced from a depot in Huntly and if it meets the correct specifications, its environmental impact is significantly less than gas or diesel.
