All links which usually work in Chrome should continue to work in Microsoft Edge. You can import your Chrome favourites to Edge by entering the following link into your Edge browser edge://settings/profiles/importBrowsingData

As always, we would ask network users to be cautious when clicking on any link they may be directed to while browsing the internet. If you find you a website you need does not work in Edge – and please do check first – please log a call with the service desk, including the website address.
