Respiratory illness - symptomatic staff: Staff members are no longer required to test for COVID-19 unless you have a health condition which means you are eligible for coronavirus treatments. World Hepatitis Day – testing and treating Yesterday was World Hepatitis Day. Viral hepatitis is a global health crisis, causing over a million deaths worldwide each year, yet we have the means to prevent and treat these diseases. An estimated 39,000 people across Scotland are chronically affected by hepatitis C – with just under half not yet aware of their infection. Available data suggests hepatitis B affects approximately 9000 people in Scotland, with more than half unaware of their infection. In Grampian, our aim is to find and treat people affected by viral hepatitis and to spread the word about how to prevent infection. We need to do this as quickly as possible - people living with untreated chronic hepatitis can't wait any longer for life-saving treatment.

All blood borne viruses are treatable, but if left untreated can lead to serious illness and death. Hepatitis C can be treated and cured with a short course of tablets and Hepatitis B can be treated to ensure the person affected can stay healthy. There is also a vaccine that can prevent Hep B. Testing for and treating blood borne viruses also prevents others from becoming infected. You can get a test at your GP practice, at Grampian Sexual Health Services, or by ordering a postal testing kit.
