Critical incident declared Yesterday, following several days of significant and sustained pressure, focused on, but not exclusive to, ARI, a board critical incident was declared. We want to begin today's brief by acknowledging the huge amount of work done in recent days, not only by teams in ARI, but by services across the community and in our partner agencies. This decision was not taken lightly, and it reflects the very serious situation we find ourselves in.

One immediate step taken was to work with Scottish Ambulance Service to divert people, **where clinically appropriate**, to alternative hospitals. Other measures may include the postponement of some procedures and appointments. We will not be postponing cancer treatment or cancer diagnostics. We intend to reschedule those appointments as soon as possible.

This is an evolving situation and those of you working in teams most directly affected by this decision will receive further information from your line managers/supervisors. It is our aim to return to business as usual as soon as we can.

We want to underline the huge debt of gratitude owed to everyone who is working incredibly hard at present, implementing the decisions taken because of this declaration, working differently as a result, and those maintaining business as usual in their services.
