Final call – requesting instalments of pay arrears The Agenda for Change 24/25 pay award will be implemented this month and arrears paid in November. If you are employed under AfC and receive benefits, it may be helpful for you have the backdated increase paid to you in instalments. This is something you should discuss with your benefits advisor, but if you do wish to request instalments, this form must be completed and returned by 5 November (intranet link, networked devices only) to gram.payroll@nhs.scot Late forms will only be accepted in exceptional circumstances. Instalments will be split across 3 months/13 weeks depending on your pay arrangements.
