Interim Leadership of Health and Social Care Moray Following her appointment as Interim Chief Officer of Health and Social Care Moray, Judith Proctor will take up her post on 15 July 2024. **Contribute to R&D Strategy delivery** NHS Grampian Board approved the <u>new R&D strategy</u> for 2024-29 on 13 June, and a stakeholder workshop took place on 25 June to start developing a delivery plan. The following five short life working groups (SLWGs) were organically formed during this workshop:

- Research careers and culture
- Research infrastructure
- Overcoming equality, diversity and inclusion challenges
- Leveraging artificial intelligence, big data and genomics across clinical and care pathways
- Combined commercial and non-commercial research excellence

These SLWGs will help develop the R&D strategy delivery plan in the same format as NHS Grampian's corporate delivery plan. They will make their final presentations in a workshop at Robert Gordon University (RGU) on 17 December. **Important updates from our specialist pharmacists** The <u>gentamicin</u> and <u>vancomycin calculators</u> in the Right Decisions app have been re-validated by the Scottish Antimicrobial Prescribing Group (SAPG) with minor changes to the content and are now UKCA accredited. As a result of this, we will no longer be using the Excel versions that have been hosted on the Intranet and the above links will take you directly to the new versions. The gentamicin and vancomycin guidelines will be updated in due course with the new information on accessing calculators.

The desktop icon for access to local antimicrobial guidelines via all HEPMA desktops is also changing and will now appear with the Right Decisions logo. This replaces the previous Antimicrobial Companion.
