Disruption to Remote Access - AOVPN / Direct Access - ongoing issues Our digital team are continuing to work hard on resolving the AOVPN/Direct Access issue. Following investigation, a new fibre optic cable needs to be installed to replace the cable damaged in the electrical fire at ARI earlier this week.

It is difficult to confirm when this will be resolved. If you require access to NHS systems and services, which you normally access remotely on a laptop and cannot access remotely at present, you should put plans in place to work from an NHS Grampian building over the weekend and on Monday (2 September).

As previously highlighted, this fault impacts on the ability to connect to the NHS Grampian network using AOVPN or Direct Access from NHS Grampian laptops. Access to Microsoft 365 services such as Teams and Outlook are **not** impacted by this as they are **not** reliant on AOVPN or Direct Access. There will be a further update issued on Monday.

Putting People First open session - Community Appointment Days and Community-Led Approaches Putting People First is our new approach to listening to, and involving, everyone living in the local area. Part of setting the foundations is to support a small number of teams to hold appointment/outpatient sessions in local communities. These are known as 'Community Appointment Days' and they focus on a particular condition or service such as physiotherapy. Clinicians will be joined by community supports and charities to offer a 'one-stop shop' to those who come along. Community Appointment Days are aimed at making services more effective by enabling better collaboration with local resources, helping people to manage their own conditions more effectively, and connecting them with other organisations and groups who can support them.

Beyond this, we're interested in the different ways we can involve communities in health and care more broadly. We are holding an informal open session at **10am on Tuesday 3 September** on Teams for anyone who wants to find out more or get involved and be inspired by the great work happening in this space. Colleagues will be speaking about the following exciting approaches:

- Laura Sutherland will tell us about the work ongoing in Elgin to deliver a Community Appointment Day around MSK issues, which will be taking place in just a couple of weeks!
- Lindsey Kelly will discuss work undertaken around Long Covid including community drop-in session for patients and professionals.
- Deborah Byars and Paul Southworth will talk about early planning to develop a Community Appointment Day around chronic pain in Aberdeen City.
- Gbemileke Majekodunmi from GREC will be speaking about Health MOT days among speakers
 of languages other than English in Aberdeen.
