**Dementia Awareness Week** Well done to everyone working across Grampian for their contribution to this annual campaign. There have been trainings, drop-in sessions, and 'tea and a blether' meetups taking place up and down the region.

To mark the end of the week, the Stress & Distress Core group wanted to share the 'Stress and Distress in Dementia Iceberg Model' poster with you all (attached to the email used to send this brief). This poster was developed by the core group, with help from wider staff and families. It can be printed or saved as a PDF and shared with any relevant staff teams. We would encourage any teams working with people living with dementia to display the poster in appropriate staff or clinical areas.

The iceberg model helps us to consider what the potential underlying causes of distress may be. It's important we try to understand the cause and contributing factors to distressed behaviour. This can help us to better understand the experience of those we support, to help alleviate distress, and be proactive in preventing distress from occurring.
