Revised Agenda for Change Band 2 and Band 3 nursing clinical support worker profiles You will be aware work to implement the revised Agenda for Change Band 2 and 3 nursing clinical support worker profiles for those in substantive posts was completed in last summer. Implementation of the revised profiles for **bank workers** is now underway. It is clear the process for bank healthcare support workers cannot be the same, due to the need to manage clinical risk, the greater volume of bank workers, and overall capacity. As such, a phased process has been agreed:

- Phase 1 Individuals with both a substantive post as an AfC Band 3 HCSW and who hold a HCSW bank worker contract.
- Phase 2 Nursing and Midwifery students who hold a HCSW bank worker contract
- Phase 3 Individuals who hold solely a HCSW bank worker contract, and those who hold a HCSW bank contract along with a substantive post as an AfC Band 2 HCSW.

Detailed work is being done to move ahead with the groups in Phase 1 and 2. Plans are being developed for those within the phase 3 cohort. There will be further updates on this work in future briefs.

Clinical skills for healthcare support workers Drop-in sessions will take place throughout June at ARI, to support Band 3 senior healthcare support workers in acute. These sessions will cover blood glucose monitoring, fluid balance management, NEWS, documentation in patient notes, fundamental wound care, and urinalysis. All sessions will take place in the Level 5 teaching room, Green Zone, ARI. Dates and time below, no booking required.
