Public sector finances The Scottish Government has laid out £500 million worth of savings required across the public sector including health and social care. This letter: <u>Scottish Government Pre-Budget</u> <u>Fiscal Update: Letter to Finance Committee - gov.scot (www.gov.scot)</u> from the Finance Secretary to the Finance and Public Administration Committee, gives high level information on where savings will be made. We don't yet know the detail of what this will mean for us as a board, or for the health and social care partnerships in Grampian. We will continue to provide regular updates on finance as we get them.
