**Urgent – linen service contingency measures** Following machinery breakdown, our linen services team have introduced contingency measures, as follows:

- Linen must be used appropriately it is for patient use only
- Priority linen orders will be processed, other orders may have to wait.
- Departments must utilise stock currently available to them
- Please ensure **only** soiled linen is returned in the soiled linen stream. The team are seeing clean linen in this stream, which then has to be rewashed, due to the risk of cross contamination

The linen services team appreciate your patience, support, and cooperation with the above measures. They understand the pressure clinical services are under and ask similar understanding is shown to their team while repairs are undertaken.
