**NHS Superannuation Scheme – annual benefits statement update** The Scottish Public Pensions Agency (SPPA) have provided the following update for scheme members:

Active members who are not eligible for the 2015 Remedy

Your Annual Benefit Statement for 2024 is now available. All active (in work) members of the NHS Scotland Pension Scheme will receive an Annual Benefit Statement. You can view your Annual Benefit Statement by visiting the SPPA's member portal: <a href="Login and Registration">Login and Registration</a> | SPPA (pensions.gov.scot) Your Annual Benefit Statement includes:

Accrued pension benefits
Current level of death benefits
Lifetime Allowance (LTA) information

To qualify for 2024 Annual Benefit Statement:

You must have paid pension contributions between 1 April 2023 and 31 March 2024 You must have been an active contributing member of the scheme at 31 March 2024 and at the point the statement is calculated

· Active members who are eligible for the 2015 Remedy

If you are eligible for the 2015 Remedy\*, your Annual Benefit Statement will be combined with a Remedial Service Statement in a new document known as an ABS-RSS. You will receive your ABS-RSS by the regulatory deadline of March 2025. The ABS-RSS will provide you with benefit estimates for the final salary (legacy) scheme and reformed (CARE) scheme for the remedy period so that you are better informed to make a choice regarding the benefits you wish to take for the remedy period when you retire.

**Safe Access Zones** Safe Access Zones are in place everywhere that abortion services are provided in Scotland from 24 September 2024. Within a Safe Access Zone, it's illegal to try to influence, harass, or prevent anyone from accessing or providing abortion services. There are 30 safe access zones across Scotland, 4 in Grampian.
