In **three** weeks, we will be implementing the national MCAS (Microsoft Conditional Access Security) policy to protect organisational data. If you use a personal device to access work Microsoft 365 applications (e.g. email, Teams, etc) you must take action to continue to access after the policy is applied. Car-parking – Foresterhill multi-storey update and general etiquette We know those of you based at Foresterhill are keen for an update on our request to vary the planning conditions for the multi-storey car park and make it a permanent, shared, facility for patients, visitors, and staff. Following submission of our application, Aberdeen City Council requested further technical information from us on monitoring, enforcement, and current usage. This has been provided and we continue to await a decision. In the meantime, staff access is temporarily permitted from Level 6 and above.

We would encourage everyone parking in the multi-storey car park to reverse park whenever possible, as this makes exiting easier, improving the overall traffic flow.

Regardless of which site you work on, please ensure you are following the parking requirements. Spaces for ambulances or Blue Badge holders must be respected, along with hatched areas and double yellow lines. If you are parking off-site, please be mindful of our immediate neighbours.
