What to expect:

- The maintenance outage will start at 10am. During the maintenance window, any shared files or folders that reside on NHSG-PUBLIC-01 will not be accessible. We expect NHSG-PUBLIC-01, and all its services and file shares to be accessible by no later than 6pm.
- Should your shared drive (V:\) reside on NHSG-PUBLIC-01 there should be no noticeable difference once the maintenance is complete.

To minimise disruption to your workflow, we recommend taking the following actions before the migration date:

- Identify Critical Files: Departments that rely on immediate access to specific files e.g. Business
 Continuity Plans, should save those files locally to their computers or following best practice,
 paper copies of these critical documents should be checked they are up to date prior to this work
 being carried out.
- Download Necessary Documents: If you require access to specific documents during the migration window, download them to your local machine beforehand or print them out.
