Agenda for Change 2023 deal/Band 5 nursing review As highlighted in the brief on Wednesday, we have received further information about the move to a consistent process for reviewing Band 5 nursing posts, with the potential to regrade to Band 6. The national portal for this will open on **Monday 17 June**. There remains a considerable amount of work to do to implement this process, and there will be further national meetings next week. We will keep you informed of developments, but we want to reassure you there is no closing date for this review at present, therefore there is no immediate pressure to have review requests ready for 17 June.
